





[Prisoner of Night and Fog by Anne Blankman](#)

In 1930s Munich, the favorite niece of rising political leader Adolph Hitler is torn between duty and love after meeting a fearless and handsome young Jewish reporter.




[Inventing Victoria by Tonya Bolden](#)

Essie, a young black woman in 1880s Savannah, is offered the opportunity to leave her shameful past and be transformed into an educated, high-society woman in Washington, D.C.




[Code Talker by Joseph Bruchac](#)


[Voices : the final hours of Joan of Arc by David Elliott](#)


[The Silence of Bones by June Hur](#)


[Butterfly Yellow by Thanh Hà Lai](#)


[Dreamland Burning by Jennifer Latham](#)


[The Downstairs Girl by Stacey Lee](#)


[Bloody Jack by L.A. Meyer](#)
